Cleaning Encasements

by Joel Reznick

I find that naval jelly works well in cleaning corrosion off of aluminum encasements.

However, keep naval jelly off of the coin. Lighter Fluid also works well for both the coin and the aluminum encasement. When using the later use a terry cloth. Sometimes just soap and water works if the piece just has residue. Avoid cleaning if the piece looks decent as is but cleaning of some pieces enhances the appearance.

New shape identified

Several issues ago all the known shapes of encasements were listed. Recently, Bill Kopenen wrote that he has a cocktail glass shaped encasement. It reads:

Milwaukee Advertising Mirrors

Advertising mirrors were first made after the turn of the century and continue to be made today. They were made in a small size to be carried in the pocket or purse and a larger size to be used as a paperweight.

The mirrors contain advertising similar to a token or medal. Thus, they are a form of exonomia. Businesses gave these away free to their customers. They were kept for a long time because they were a functional item that never wore out.

There are at least one hundred mirrors from Milwaukee. The older ones are covered with a clear film called celluloid. The scarcest of all the mirrors are the encased coin mirrors. There are only two known from Milwaukee and both are pocket mirrors. The Hofbrau piece contains a 1910 cent while the Julien piece contains a 1929 cent. Both coins are uncirculated. The date of the cent indicates the year the mirror was given away. The cents also discouraged the customer from discarding the mirror and may

even have brought the owner good luck.

Since these mirrors contain a coin they are of interest to numismatists and are eagerly collected by them.



Hawaiian Encased

Hi! My name is Alan Catz. I've been collecting U.S. coins since 1958, and virtually all kinds of tokens, including Hawaiian, since 1987. For the purpose of this publication, encased coinage is among my interests. Previously, in the August 1997 issue of The

Casement, I reported on the difficulty of acquiring all but the most "common" of Hawaiian encased....Perhaps 4 or 5 out of the 50+ listed (including sub-varieties) in Medcalf's reference on Hawaiian Tokens and Money. Living in Hawaii, if all I collected were Hawaiian encased, I'd be lucky to average one new piece to my collection every couple of years! And you could bet I'd have to pay 1 1/2 to 2 1/2x book value for it...regardless of condition! Almost all harder encased catalog for \$25-\$35 in EF condition with the exception of The Hawaii Music Company piece which lists at \$65. Obviously, some are infinitely more scarce than others and, as with most Hawaiian tokens and Hawaiiana in general, local collectors like to keep local collectibles in the islands, cherishing its history and their heritage. Understandable!! Once again, many encased are infrequently sold on the open market, often going privately between collectors, either through sale or trade.

I try to purchase only nice examples (undamaged VF and better), but it really doesn't matter, since examples in any condition rarely become available. I have, over the years, passed up trying to compete for 3 or 4 pieces that I don't have, but which were offered in below VF..showing moderate to heavy marks, peeing on the encasement, and/or corrosion on the cent. So, which encased do I own, and what's available on a semi-regular basis?

My holdings: Both varieties/B&S Specialty Ad, Ph: 9464-118, horseshoe, 1970 cent (Both with and without Solomon Hoe, Jr. on it); Island Coin Exchange, Honolulu, Hawaii, 1111 Bishop St. & Ala Moana center, round, 1964 cent, Irving Kam Honolulu, HI, U.S. Coins & Hawaiian Buy/Sell, horseshoe, 1988 cent; and, of the better pieces, Doc Hill/Vote for Senator, horseshoe, 1946 cent (I have the plate piece); and McInerny's Shoes/Be Lucky and Wear/Shoes for the Whole Family, horseshoe, 1937 cent (earliest dated cent in a Hawaiian encased).

What I've seen since 1993: Several of the B&S Specialty Ad (both types, moreso with S. Hoe on it)...was fortunate recently to pick up a S. Hoe variety for nearly 1/2 cat. price; 1 or 2 other Doc Hill's and McInerny's (not as nice as mine, but evidently, of the tougher issues, these appear to show up more frequently); and 1 each of: Hirose Nurseries, Hilo Hawaii (this piece supposedly comes in 2 varieties...one says Say It With Flowers, the other Say It With Orchids...don't recall which one I viewed); Tin Hop Pang Insurance, 1945 cent (this one was well worn); Territorial Motors, Ltd. Willy's Distributors Territory of Hawaii, horseshoe, 1948 cent (this one, a decent VF, sold for \$70, double the \$35 cat. price). And, late last year, I witnessed a Choice Unc. Hawaii Music Company Music Dept. of the Moses Co. Everything Musical Ph. 2024, round, 1946 cent, trade hands from a renown local collector/dealer to a Washington dealer for \$125. As mentioned above, this is supposedly the rarest of all

encased to find as evidenced by its \$65 cat. price.

Which ones I'd like to own and why:

Norman's Mortuary Wailuku Maui-although I don't own a crematory token (yes, these do exist as collectibles!), I do own both New York Civil War Tokens picturing a coffin (undertakers J.J. Diehl and Fr. Friese). An odd ad piece for a mortuary I feel, as encased were made not only to advertise, but also to bestow good fortune and luck (?) to the recipient...Ironic!

Pack & Troop 212, 460 John Eda Rd., Honolulu, horseshoe, 1945 cent....just because I like older scouting collectibles and, with the end of WWII, many future scouting leaders of my boyhood returned home to inspire a generation of baby-boomers in coin collecting and can-do.

Sinclair Travel Unlimited Kemoo - Wahiawa Phs 6515-21355 Hon. 40554, horseshoe, 1949 cent...I lived a total of 6 1/2 years on Wheeler AFB (now Army Air Field) which is a Wahiawa address. Kemoo is an old "watering hole" (still in existence) on Lake Wilson, adjacent to the base... it reeks with island history, attested to by the Prohibition Era photos of bygone-era autos lined up outside the establishment that hang inside the Cantina lobby these days.

When I become fortunate to view, or add another Hawaiian encased to my holdings, an update to this report will follow. In the meantime, happy hunting for your most wanteds in this great hobby of ours!

Cataloging and Lottery encased

Another Casement is due soon. I wanted to write on two things this time: 1. cataloging encased and 2. lottery encased. I am not certain whether I have written before (i.e., in August) on the topic of cataloging encased, if I have edit what I say so I am not redundant.

I have decided to undertake the project of cataloging all Ohio encased. My understanding is that you have cataloged Wisconsin encased and Steve Drake has cataloged Nebraska encased. Has any other states been cataloged?

I ask all ACE members to help me in cataloging Ohio encased. Please send me your complete list of Ohio encased. Anyone who helps will receive a copy of the final listing.

I expect to have the listing done around this time next year or perhaps the first of 1999. One source I do have is old auction records, although my collection only goes back about 3 years or so. Bob Slawsky has promised to help me by sending me copies of some of his old catalogs. If any of you have any catalogs going back before 1995, I would appreciate copies of the encased listings.

If one person would take charge of each of the other 47 states, eventually we would have available as complete a listing of encased as possible.

One type of encased that I particularly like I call "Lottery Encased." Right now, I know of only four types, the first three round, the fourth horseshoe: 1.

the 1950 Lownsbury Chevrolet Co. piece (801 Front Street, Toledo, Ohio) which has a five digit number at the bottom; 2. the 1937 Newark Ledger piece, in which the cent is off center, and which contains either a five digit number of the type XX-XXX or a five digit number without hyphen proceeded by a letter above the cent obverse; 3. the 1965 Conshohocken (Pennsylvania) Federal Savings piece with a five digit number stamped in below the cent; and 4. the 1955D People's Trust Co. of Bergen County, Hasbrouck Heights, New Jersey, with a five digit number stamped above the cent. It would appear that each of these pieces was involved in some sort of lottery with one or more "winning" numbers being drawn. Does anyone have any information on these drawings (what was up for grabs, etc.)? does anyone know of any more pieces like these. Please write me or reply in the Casement. (Editors note: Jim is on the same page as were the members who attended the 3rd annual ACE meeting in Omaha. The state volunteer cataloger list follows.)

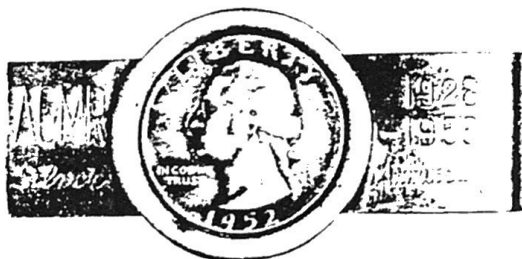

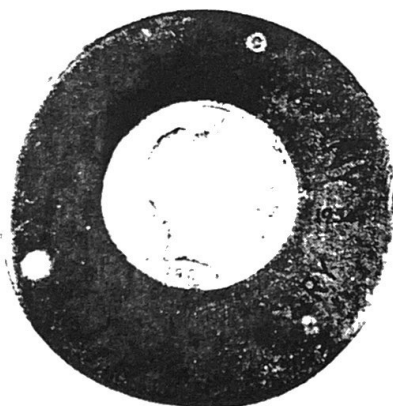

Encased dollars are all scarce. The two usually encountered types are the Buick and Caivert Distillers.

Back about 1960 I picked up a Buick dollar. At that time, just like many others, I had a few encased cents thrown in the bottom of a junk box. But the encased dollar caught my fancy, so at a coin show I went over to an old dealer friend, Bill Ross, from Pittsburgh, Pa., who dealt a lot in medals and tokens. We talked about encased coins, and when I mentioned that I had picked up this encased dollar he told me that there was a second type; he couldn't remember the name, but it was issued by some kind of whiskey company.

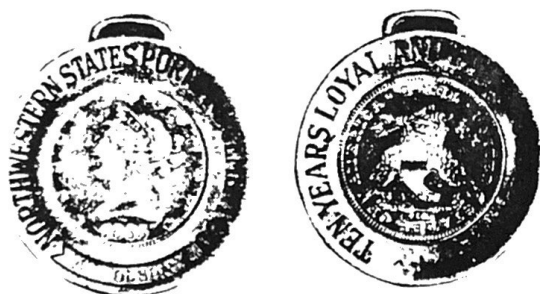
encased in a cardboard frame. Issued by General Electric, the frame is laminated, 8 by 11 inches, and houses a dollar, two quarters, six dimes, and a cent (one dime and the cent are seen on the back). I guess if coin collectors can have their Panama-Pacific gold

set in a copper frame, then encased coin collectors can have their set also. In this case we have to settle for cardboard instead of copper, and silver instead of gold. I wonder how many of these sets were destroyed during the silver melt of 1980.

Well, now that I've mentioned the gold Pan-Pac set, let's look at a few of the gold encased pieces. All are rare, and if you come by one it probably is unique. Others were probably made of each of the three illustrated pieces but, of course, they would have been issued to other people. So each is unique in this way.

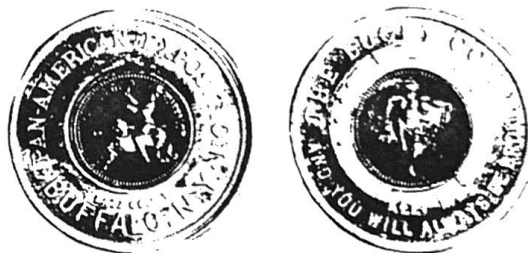

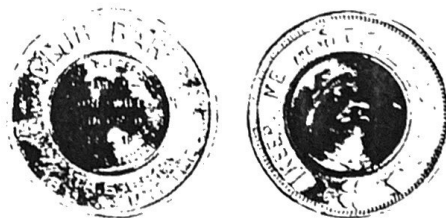

Now we will explore the "gray area" of encased coins. What is an encased coin, and what "sort of" is and "sort of" isn't? Since the previously illustrated Employee's Loan & Finance Corp. piece is definitely a button type encased coin, let's look at other "capped" cents. Some capped cents easily come loose, but each of these Admiral Byrd pieces came in a cardboard frame of sorts, and the caps were plated with copper, gold, or silver. They should probably be considered encased cents. But what about some of the other capped cents?
