Editor's Message

Hello to all and hoping that issue 14 finds everyone well. In the great state of Wisconsin winter is just around the corner which means for us northern members more time indoors and more opportunity to delve into our hobby of encased. It will be easier to find time to scan mail bids, identify mavericks, get our collections in order, label and identify new acquisitions, catch up on mail, look over our collections, crack open a reference book or two, scan the internet and so fourth.

The NATCA national at Collinsville in August turned out to be a fun show. ACE members Phil Bressett (Racine), Jerry Panfill (Milw) and I made the trip. There was plenty of neat stuff to look at and dealer to dealer sales were strong. Collector sales were down from 97 Omaha but it was a successful show. Phil and I sold a variety of Exonumia and Jerry added to his Wis. good for collection and purchased several neat encased. We met about 15 ACE members and all were enthusiastic about the hobby and all were interesting to talk too. Its always nice to talk the hobby and share information. Adjacent to our table was the table of ACE

member Norris Wahl (IA) who seemed to have a very brisk business. We did manage to converse between customers and I did have a chance to see Norris' encased collection which was not for sale. Norris has one of the finest encased collections in the mid-west if not the entire U.S. Norris keeps his collection in 3 1/2 x 3 1/2" boxes and uses the larger cardboard flip. His collection is placed by date of the coin so all of his Indians are together. Norris looks for the higher grade, problem free specimens, truly he is a discriminating collector/ dealer. ACE members will benefit from Norris' collection for he offered any of his pieces to be used for photographing, if needed for the upcoming books. A gesture which is appreciated.

Our ACE meeting went well with the usual informal discussion of various topics. As for producing an ACE encased, Chuck Burger (NE), Larry Edell (KA) and Randy Partin (FL) all thought it was a worthwhile endeavor provided that the project would be self-supporting. This of course for the obvious reason (our treasury is a shoe string operation).

Rather then asking for entire membership support and many small loans, M. Allen (MN), Phil Bressett (WI) and yours truly will borrow the money and then as sales take place the loans will be reimbursed. Any monies after cost will go into the ACE treasury for further encased production. It was decided to produce an ACE encasement honoring the hobby and if that "pans" out produce one from each state featuring a major happening or topic partial to that state. Production numbers and sales will determine how many. The thought is to eventually complete all the states within a 10 year period. Much like the quarters that the mint is doing. In this way ACE will be contributing to the hobby and hopefully draw future collectors.

The first will read, We All Have Our Hobbies/ Dedicated to Encased Coin Collectors/ Assoc. Collectors of Encased (ACE)/ founded 1995, Pleasant Prairie, Wis. or some version of this. It was decided to make a set of three, encasing a U.S. cent, a Canadian Cent and Panama centavo.(subject to change pending availibility). As for the cost a set of three would sell for \$5.00 plus postage and be limited to 100 sets. The remainder will be singles made up of the U.S. cent only. Cost of these would be \$2.00 each plus postage.

The second encasement would feature Wisconsin and commemorate its sesquicentennial 1848 - 1998, 150th anniversary, exact wording to be determined. Again a set would be offered. (according to Chuck Burger, this is the only way to regroup cost and he is right) The set and cost is yet to be determined.

The third encasement will feature Minnesota, Land of the Vikings or something dealing with their new governor. Actual wording to be determined.

The fourth and thereafter will follow the Quarter release and the States shown on the quarter dollars. Here is where we need ACE member help, what would you like to see on the various states and more importantly on your state? Let us know.

Again, how far we go with this will depend on sales. Any profits will go into production of the next encased and ultimately into the ACE treasury. It sounds like it just might work, so stay tuned, more will follow in issue 15. Remember this all started from Steve Drake (NE) and Bill Waken (OK) and their suggestion that ACE should produce an encased. ACE may very well produce 51 different encased when its all over. Sounds interesting to say the least. JB

Maybe not enough to make it a different type. The design is a bit different.

The American Museum of Atomic Energy

More on Tom Casper's issue I have an encased 13 article: dime, 1954 Roosevelt, blk letters, around the dime, it reads: American Museum of Atomic Energy-Neutron Irradiated. This is attached to a card that reads a little different then Tom's: The American Museum Of Atomic Energy, Oak Ridge, Tennessee Production of Radioactive Silver-This dime was placed 110 near a source of neutrons for a short time. some of the normal silver atoms in the dime were struck by neutrons and were changed into radioactive silver-110 atoms. The radioactive atoms of silver have a half-life of 22 seconds. Through the emission of beta particles half of the radioactive silver atoms change into atoms of cadmium each 22 seconds. Pictured is a diagram of the four steps. Near the bottom it states: The radiation given off by the radioactive silver is so slight that there is no danger of injury. AEC, Oak Ridge, Tenn. W-21383 Perhaps a newer version of what Tom C. has-----

Two interesting observations from Al Weinberg, Woodland Hills, CA

Two observations of probable interest to ACE readers.

Jim Lawniczak reports (pg 9) that an "orginal" 1893 Indian Head cent encased recently appeared in a Grinolds catalog.

As early as that is, it is not the earliest known "ordinal" encased cent.

I am convinced that honor goes to the Monte Carlo Dawson 25 cent good-for [Yukon Territory]. Even though it is technically a Canada token, it is of interest to both Alaska and Yukon Territory collectors and traditionally brings \$275-\$450, depending on condition. It contains an 1889 Indian Head cent.

Of moderate rarity (I'd say a dozen are known) it appears in VG-EF condition. The finest known, to my knowledge, is EF and is in my collection, ex-Hillel Kaslove collection, retired ANS and CNB curator.

All known specimens contain orginal, as struck 1889 Indian Cents. Probably new Unc. pennies when inserted into these post-1900 encasements. I've handled perhaps 6 of the dozen known.

A second "revelation". At the August Portland ANA, I was offered (and examined) an "outrageous" and previously unknown 1901 Indian Head cent chamberpot encased from the "Ruby Saloon Dunne Bros. Yuma, Ariz. Good for one drink". Same legend as on the 2-known (?) round celluloid 1901 Indian Head cent encased from the same turn of the century territorial saloon.

Hal Birt, Jr., Arizona researcher/cataloger, verified to me it is a newly reported rarity. One known at present.

The encased chamberpot I examined was barely VF with several noticeable scratches across the rt. side of the penny and into the legend of the aluminum encasement. I had to make an offer and offered what I thought was an outrageous \$505.

Guess what? The owner was only "fishing". He declined. Startled, I asked what amount he wanted. He responded "\$1,000.", obviously doubting my all-too-honest high offer (remember, it is a scratched-up low end very fine - no beauty). I declined. Heck, I wouldn't have paid \$550. \$505 was top dollar. But this "character" automatically doubled my offer. I'm no slouch in paying good prices. But this offended me.

What is the expression? "There oughta be a law."

Hawaii Encased by Al Catz

Hi! Al Catz sitting in West Palm (FL) Airport awaiting morning flight back to Hawaii, home of many nifty, but alas hard to find encased cents!

Right before my 8/27 departure for Florida, pieces of an old and large collection of Hawaiian tokens became available from a local dealer. Collections of this magnitude do not normally surface on the open market once but every several years, and, although individual acquisitions were by no means cheap, the opportunity to add a piece or 2 to my Hawaiian collection was just too tempting to pass up!

Although I didn't have first dibs, I did manage to purchase (of the encased offered) a 1945 Smitty's Cafe Maxim, Honolulu, Oahu, T.H., horseshoe in XF+ or so (2EN-42 in Medcalf's Book on Hawaiian Tokens & Money). And, sadly, virtually pulled from my clutches, was a 1941 New Senator Hotel (2EN-35) in Unc.!...a very scarce Hawaiian encased.

It was exciting, however, that I got to view several pieces that I had never actually seen before! Among them: 2EN-40, 1948, Sears Service Must Shine in '49 Keep Me Shiny; not described in the reference work is the fact that this particular encased is looped, uniface (no writing on reverse of encasement), and copper (or gilt -brass)...round, it is larger than the usual round encased perhaps

40mm or so without loop.
Overall, an unusual looking encased! I also saw a 2EN-29, 1941, The Lido Cafe...The Best Drink and Food in Town; in the book, it states that this piece was made from a wartime aluminum substitute. To me, it appeared to be a plated steel alloy, as this particular example exhibited some surface rust spots. Can't seem to recall, but this piece may also have been looped at top.

Unfortunately, the seller did not keep a record of the individual encased pieces within the collection; I understand that 6 or so others were sold that I didn't get a chance to see and report to you on in this article. Take care, Alan

A Letter from Duane H. Feisel, Sec. of NATCA, Calf. catalog on encased planned

First off, enclosed is my check and membership application form for ACE.

I had every intention of talking with you at the St. Louis show, but for whatever reason it never happened. I was pretty busy for most of the time, but there were times I had a chance to wander the floor. In any event, I wanted to let you know that the Western States Token Society (WESTS) has a current project to prepare a catalog listing of California encased coins. When I saw a sample copy of your August issue of The Casement, i noted that you are quarterbacking an effort to catalog encasements for the entire US. That will be quite a project, but the way to do it is just as you are doing it-get regional specialists involved to

do the listings for their area. WESTS sponsored a catalog of California (and incidentally Nevada) Food Stamp Credit Tokens which was published earlier this year. I don't know if you ever have seen a copy of that catalog, but it is 81/2 x 11", plastic spiral bound, card cover plastic protected, tokens and locations are heavily documented, and virtually every piece is illustrated. We are a non-profit educational organization, so that is how we are using the profits from our annual Token Jamboree. At a meeting this last August we decided the next project would be the encased coins of California. The anticipation is that we will eventually produce a listing, probably in the same format as the Food Stamp catalog, and it will have a completion date of January 2000.

Now, one thing that is vitally important is to have a listing format that is right. By "right" I mean something that is acceptable to collectors for ease of use, accuracy, completeness, etc., etc. I note that in the state listings you are publishing that there is absolutely no consistency in the listings. If you are going to eventually do a consolidated listing, you are definitely going to need consistency. And you need to start that consistency right now. When you attempt to do the nationwide catalog, you should don't want to try to then develop consistency for what might be 50 different listing formats!

At our WESTS meeting coming up in mid-October, we will be presenting a variety of possible listing formats to our members who attend to get their comments and reactions. Hopefully, we will settle on a workable format that will have everything going for it.

The person spearheading the WESTS effort is John C. Hoffman. I spoke with him on the telephone this evening and told him about ACE. He wants to become a member, so please used the enclosed SASE to send him a copy of the application form - please put in my name as "Recommended by" if you will. He is the one who is currently collecting listings and preparing the preliminary formats. We will appeal eventually to all the WESTS members for listings from them.

Anyhow, that's about it for now.

Collecting an Encasement from the 50 States by Steven C. Drake

A person can collect encasements several different ways. Probably the most common ways are to collect the encasements from the state you live in, collecting different dates, and collecting an encasement from each state.

First, I will give a little background on how I started collecting encasements. A few years ago the Omaha Coin Club became the host of a national token show held on Labor Day weekend. I was the show chairman for the show. I was not a token collector, but soon I would become active in the token area. There are some "die hard" token collectors in Nebraska. I realized soon that I was not going to be able to compete with these token collectors. At these token shows were always some encasements, prices seemed reasonable compared to some token prices. At that time in Nebraska, there were just 3-4 people that I would say collected encasements. After acquiring several Nebraska pieces, I decided to branch out in collecting encasements, so I decided to obtain an encasement from each state. I did not know what a challenge it would be to complete a "collection of the 50 states".

At the beginning of 1998 I needed nine more states. I told myself, this was going to be my year to complete the collection. In the National Token Collector Association (NATCO) monthly publication Talkin' Tokens I saw an advertisement from a person who lived in Alaska that had Alaska tokens and related items for sale. He listed an e-mail address so I wrote him e-mail. which was the first time I wrote someone relating to the hobby over the internet. The only other times I used the Internet was for work or to write my children at college. He wrote back saying he had a couple, so I wrote saying I would take both of them since I had a friend also collecting the 50 states. The Alaskan encasement arrived March 2nd. On March 10th. I received a Kentucky encasement

that I had bid on in a Dick Grinolds auction, so now I needed 7 encasements.

Being a member of NATCO you receive a membership directory. So in March I decided to write NATCA members that lived in Hawaii. When I write, I always include a self-addressed stamped envelope for a reply, I figure this is just a small price to pay for information. I did not receive any replies until May. A gentleman wrote back saying he located one for me. I agreed with the price, so on May 16th I received the Hawaii encasement. Meanwhile in April, I received an Alabama encasement from a Randy Partin auction in NATCO. So now I was down to five states. By writing e-mail and letters I would focus on a couple more states, so back to the NATCO directory. I found no members living in Maine, but two people were listed as Maine token collectors. A collector in Vermont and one in Wisconsin. The person in Vermont had an email address, so I decided to give him a try. He said he had sold his only Maine encasement a couple of months earlier. So finally I wrote the person in Wisconsin. I did not think I would get a Maine encasement from Wisconsin, but I did. The person from Cottage Grove said he had one, and would trade for one from Omaha, since he had relatives in the area. So on May 26th a Belfast, Maine horseshoe encasement from Perry's Nut House arrived. At the same time period of trying to get a Maine encasement I found a person in

NATCO that was in Lingle, Wyoming interested in Wyoming & Nebraska tokens. I thought this might be the place to start for Wyoming. Pay dirt! He had a Chevrolet piece from Torrington, Wyoming, so on May 29th I had three states to go: Mississippi, Utah and New Mexico. My next state I would work on was Utah. NATCO listed eleven members that lived in Utah. I wrote letters to four of them. Finally, a person from Manti, Utah wrote back and said he was making a trade for two encasements and would sell me one. H wrote back again saying he was unable to make the trade. but he was going to a coin show at the end of June and he would try to find me one. On July 2nd I received a Salt Lake City encasement of John Douglas Jewelers/round/1952. Just Mississippi and New Mexico to go. Back to NATCO directory. It listed 3 members in Mississippi and 7 members in New Mexico. I could taste victory. I wrote 10 more letters, and 10 return envelopes, \$6.40 in postage. One person wrote back from Mississippi saying he had an extra Early Chevrolet Co. from Vicksburg, it arrived on the mail on July 30th. Just New Mexcio to go. One letter came back because the forwarding address expired. Three others wrote back saying they did not have any, and had hardly seen any. Finally, a man wrote from Peralta, New Mexico wrote saying he had just 3 encasements in 30 years of collecting tokens. One was a duplicate and he would sell it to me. August 10th I finally completed the 50 states when a Belen. NM encasement of the First National

Bank/horseshoe/1950-D came in the mail.

While trying to obtain an encasement from the 50 states, I realized the last few I needed were from states that did not have a large population in the late 40's and 1950's when encasements were more plentiful. So keep this in mind if you try to collect the 50 states.

Sometimes just a little story or memory about a place or a person brings a piece of life. Every one of Earl's pieces has a story if we just knew them.

One of the most interesting stories I've found should have been included in my book but was left out in error by the publisher. It is about Rose Johnson, who had the following piece made by Earl Fankhauser:

IN-BLU-JO-10 JOHNSON'S ANTIQUES//327 W. MARKET/BLUFFTON,IND.

Rose Johnson ran a high-class antique business out of her massive two-story Victorian home. Visits to her showings were by appointment only. She was also the head bookkeeper at Farmers and Merchants Bank in Bluffton, Indiana. Rose started working there in 1936 when she was 16 years old, and had the trust of everyone at this family-

owned bank. In 1965, while she was on an extended leave for an operation, her friends tried to be kind by doing some of her work. Instead they found a shortage of \$216,752.47. In a widelypublicized case Rose pleaded guilty to misappropriation of funds. She had been using the money to finance her antique business! They found her home packed from the attic to the basement with rare pieces of. glassware, many of exceptional value, which more than covered the loss. The joke was that Rose should have been in charge of investing the bank's money, since her antiques had appreciated much more than the bank's investments.




