\* Some facts on the maverick index from Bob Perdue....  
I've spent about the last year working on the maverick index and am willing to call what I'm sending the first draft of it. I have many requests for this information.

I had 5 copies made yesterday as trial versions. Here is what I know on the costs involved. The printing and binding cost will be \$3.50 to \$4.00 each, depending on the cover. The cost for the type of cover I'm sending you is \$1.09 each. I think that is too much and a black and white cover will serve just as well with a cost of 5 cents each. There can also be a different back cover used at a slightly lower cost, and probably will be. The exact cost to mail this (book rate) is \$1.33. The mailing envelopes are 16 cents each. That would bring the exact cost of these to about \$5.50 each. If we add a \$2.00 mandatroy

donation to ACE that would bring the total to \$7.50 each. I feel this is a relative bargain and there would be a demand for these.

I began this with the idea that it would be a fund raising project for ACE. I have no intention of making a penny on the project. I can pay for the first 25 or so out of pocket and use the proceeds from the sold catalogs to pay for the next printing. I can then write a check to ACE for the donations

## New Book being planned on Florida Encased Coins from C.R. Clark

My son, Bob Clark, and I have been working for several years on a supplement to the catalogue, **Florida Tokens** (1990), and several other Florida catalogues covering special areas. The catalogue of Florida Encased Coins is closer to completion than any of the others, so we are making an effort to complete a catalogue of the known Florida encased coins within the next few months. I started the encased coin catalogue in the mid-1980's after publishing the first Florida Token Catalogue, **Florida Trade Tokens** in 1980.

We have scans at 150%, 600 dpi. of the encased coins in our collection and others from the collections of several avid collectors in Florida. We were able to determine the type, shape, hole, etc. from scans that we received of the obverse and reverse of coins reported. We have just completed many new listings with the type and

information such as round, horseshoe, holed as made. (Rd or HS, HAM). We will include enlarged obverse pictures of all encased coins in the catalog, if possible. We presently have in the computer 385 listings of encased coins from Florida. We have good pictures (at 150%) of all 385, so our work is going very well, so far.

We have found about 20 different types and numerous sub-types for most of 20 types. All of these will be pictured and described in the book. ### (State name misspelled on Mint collector spoon)

Collectors who placed orders early with U.S. Mint for the State quarter dollar spoon containing a Kentucky quarter housed at the end of the handle got an unexpected surprise when they had their orders shipped - the state name is misspelled on the stem of the spoon.

The state name is spelled correctly on the coin, which is indistinguishable from any other Kentucky quarter dollar.

Darrell Bruner of Bruner's Collectables in Owenboro, Ky., said he ordered approximately 30 of the Kentucky quarter dollar spoons in October and placed them in his display case for sale soon after he received them from the Mint. When he later realized there was an error in the spelling of the state on the stem of the spoon, Bruner said he pulled the remaining error spoons that he hadn't already sold from the display. He said he plans to hold on to the errors.

The *Coin World* article goes on to state that the mint gave corrected versions of the spoons to any collector who returned the errors. As of Dec. 8 the Kentucky spoons with the correct spelling were available.

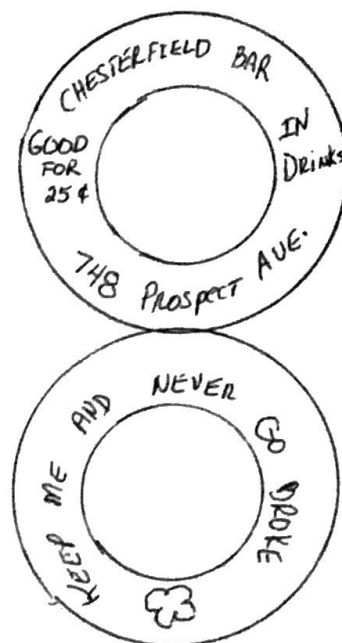
## A New Metal Detected Find from Terry Stahurski

In December of 2001 a friend of mine, Vince Belski, found an encased 1953D cent while metal detecting in a public park on the

East Side of Cleveland. The piece is described as follows: **CHESTERFIELD BAR/GOOD FOR 25c** (to the left of the coin)/**IN DRINKS** (to the right of the coin)/ **748 PROSPECT AVE./KMANGB** within a horseshoe and four leaf clover below. The encasement and coin are in fairly rough shape, which is expected from being in the ground. It appears that an attempt was made to try to cut the casement. In addition, light is visible around the coin and the coin is not oriented precisely within the casement.

Researching Cleveland Directories as well as Haine's Greater Cleveland Criss-Cross Directories (directories which are organized by street addresses instead of by company or last names), a history of the Chesterfield Bar was obtained. The Chesterfield Grille was listed at the 748 Prospect Ave. address and was owned by the LaMonte Restaurant Co. This company was incorporated in 1940 and the Chesterfield Grille was started sometime between 1947 and 1951. The Chesterfield Grille was in operation throughout the rest of the 1950s until the mid 1960s. In 1965, the name was changed to the Birdland Lounge. Several large office buildings now occupy the areas of the 700 block of Prospect Ave. in Cleveland. Besides memories, this may be all that remains of the Chesterfield Grille.

This piece is interesting because of it's "Good For" message as well as it's condition. Typically, encased coins that are found with metal detectors in NE Ohio are severely corroded due to the nature of the soil and wet conditions. **13.**

Greetings, Happy Holiday's and thanks to all of those who have taken the time to write. I'm becoming more organized and hope to be able to avoid duplication of the mavericks we are listing for identification. You will notice in the last issue there were three.

Another issue on the mavericks to address is the ACE policy of identifying mavericks to their headquarters. I tried to go through the back issues and find a specific reference to this, but was unable to find one. However, if you look through the past identifications you will see that from issue # 2 and on this has always been the policy. This is to say that when identifying an encased with the wording "Askin's Clothing" citing the existence of an Askin's Clothing store in Muncie, IN does not identify this encased. One would need to determine if this was a local store or if it were part of a chain of stores. If it were a local store only, then Muncie would be the correct identification for it. If it were a chain then one would have to research a bit further to determine where the headquarters were located and the headquarters would be the correct identification for it, even though there was a local store. When we have duplication in our identifications this is often the reason. It is a common mistake and one that I have been guilty of as well. We begin with a good example of this guideline.

SW-3 (550) 14 - Drink Dr. Swett's Root Beer - This was identified in issue #23 as being from Philadelphia on the basis of a soda bottle on Ebay. I have since received this information from Gerry McLellan and he states that some time around 1902 Dr. Swett's Root Beer shows up in the Boston, MA city directory and that in a much later directory it is shown as being from Natick, MA. He has also owned the encased and been offered several more locally. It seems this is once again a case of a company having several branches and would require more research to determine its headquarters.

AB-1 (276) 9 - A.W. Abbott's, Inc. 359 Chandler Street - Worcester, MA\*\* - Gerry McLellan. This is listed in the 1955 D&B as a plumbing and septic repair service.

BB-1 (348) 11 - B&B Shoe Store / Buster Brown Shoes - Bedford, IN\* - BP - The 1950 city directory lists B&B shoes at 1508 I Street, Phone 6172. The ad lists Buster Brown shoes for children, Roblee shoes for men, and Airstep shoes. Eugene C. West, Manager. 1973 is the last year it is listed, but with Norman E. Stadler as Manager for the first time, same location, 275-6172. Mary Hall Bedford (IN) Public Library. I can also add that this is listed in the 1955 D&B and it also indicates they had a branch store in Louisville, KY. Without an address or phone number on the encased I don't think this should be considered a positive ID, as this is a fairly common business name.

BA-17 (651) 17- Bake Rite Bread – Ft Worth, TX \*\* - Dan Agler. I have found a Bake Rite Bakery listed in Ft. Worth in the 1942 D&B. Dan notes that it is possible that this is a local business and not the headquarters, but D&B listed no such information.

BI-1 – Binghamton Chapter American Institute of Banking- Binghamton, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim relays that the American Institute of Banking is still in operation and Headquartered in NYC and also that there are only two other Binghamton's in the USA. He thinks they were too small to have a chapter and therefore considers it verified to New York.

BL-6 (619) 16- Blackhawk Coin & Stamp Club –Byron, IL\*\* - Tom Casper - Blackhawk Coin & Stamp Club. According to the ANA, this club was located in Byron, Ill. It was organized on 9-3-54, joined the ANA in June 1955, and dropped out of the ANA for non-payment of dues in 1972.

BO -7 (653) 17 and also BO-5 (510) 14- Libert Bozzelli / Councilman at large – Cuyahoga Falls, OH\*\* - Jim Lawniczak – Jim states that he bought this from a person in Stow, Ohio that knew the family. He then checked the Yahoo people search and Mr. Bozzelli is still a resident of Cuyahoga Falls today.

BR-12 (624) 16 – Bresee's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary / 1899 – 1974. Oneonta, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak –Jim was able to use information taken from the Internet to verify this piece and feels it would be too much of a coincidence that another so named store would have the same anniversary dates.

BR-4 (349) 11 – Harry Brown Motors / Desoto – Plymouth - Kansas City, KS\*\* - BP – Listed as Harry Brown Motors in the 1955 D&B.

CA-1 (49) – Capri Café / 110 Essex Street – Lawrence, MA\*\* - Gerry Mclellan. The Lawrence, MA public library, verified this.

CA-20 (631) 16-Jack C. Carr / Realtor / 139 E. Market – Indianapolis, IN\*\* - BP - I found a listing in the 1947 city directory for a Jack C. Carr realty at 139 E. Market. This is from Thomas Short of the Indianapolis Public Library.

CA – 18 (562) 15 – Jack C. Carr / Realtor / 139 E Market / MA 2374, 5106 E. 10<sup>th</sup> St – Indianapolis, IN\*\* - BP – The above information will also identify this maverick as they have slightly different wording, but the same name and address.

MO-10 (522) 14 – The Cataract, J. C. Moyer, Prop. – San Antonio, TX\*\* - Dan Agler – Dan found a piece dated 1910 with San Antonio, Texas on it.

CH-5 (511) 4 – Cheyenne Shoe Store – Cheyenne, WY\*\* - BP. Listed as Cheyenne Shoe Store in the 1955 D&B.

CO-3 (85) - Colgate Caterers Inc. / Somerset 27464 - Somerville, MA\*\* - Gerry Mclellan. 1937 Telephone directory.

OH-CO - 969 - Cook County Rambler / 6545 S. Cicero - Chicago, IL\* - Al Zaika. Al writes this is likely Chicago as Chicago is in Cook County and the zip code directory shows such a high address of S. Cicero Ave. in that city.

CO-9 (355) 11 - The Country Trust / Your Bank Close to home - White Plains, NY\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim states that he doesn't have enough information to make it positive, but feels good about the possibility of this being correct. Jim bought this from a person who knew the bank was in White Plains. He has also found a certificate on the Internet showing it was from there. It was established in 1903 and acquired many other banks from the 40's to the 60's and was itself acquired by what is now the Bank of New York in 1976. He also found a web site for Westchester County (NY) and found the bank played a prominent role in the development of the county.

DA-3 (481) - 13- Davis Cabinet Company / Employee Bonus and Silver Dollar Party / Jan. 20, 1950 - Nashville, TN\*\* - Al Zaika - Source is Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

DE-4 (357) 11 - Official Dell Comics Club Member - NY, NY \*\* - BP - I found a Dell Comics No. 6 "Pogo Possum" from 1952. It is from Dell Publishing Co., INC. / 261 Fifth Ave. / New York 16, NY. This is also listed as Dell Publishing Co Inc in the 1955 D&B.

DU-2 (71) - Dubb's Live & Dressed Poultry / 274 William St. - Buffalo, NY \*\* - Jim Lawniczak - The source is Buffalo and Erie County historical society. They also indicate this was a restaurant supplier.

EL-2 (936) 23 - Electronic Center / Hale at Brooklyn (1960D) - Ft. Wayne, IN\*\* - Bryan Ryker - This is a Fankhauser encased Bryan has cataloged as number (IN) - (FWA) - EL - 10. The cataloged encased has a 1953D cent in it. It looks as if this is a replaced cent or a new variety.

EM-1 (667) 17 - Empire National Bank / The All -Around Bank - New York, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. An ebay seller identified this to NY. He said that he had got it from the bank in NYC. He also remembered that the same bank had been the Rockland Nat'l Bank in the 1960's. Jim adds that information exactly matches the information he had taken from the Internet. Rockland Nat'l Bank merged with County Nat'l Bank in February 1970 and the resulting bank was called the Empire Nat'l Bank. Then in 1980 the bank became the State Bank of New York and in 1989 the Bank of New York.

FA-8 (570) 15 The Fair Inc / Boy's Dept -Beaumont, TX \* - Dan Agler. The Fair Inc. was headquartered in Beaumont, Texas with branches at Port Arthur & Orange, Texas. I found it in both the 1942 and 1955 Dun & Bradstreet. Dan would appreciate it if the owner would contact him with complete listing information. EDITORS NOTE - I'm sure there are many other "The Fair Stores" I have seen reference to many, but I think Dan has

hit upon the major chain of these stores. The 1955 D&B lists the store in Lake Charles, LA as being a branch of Beaumont, TX.

FA-4 (266) 8 and also FA-3 (150) – Souvenir of Fairfield County Fair. - Lancaster, Ohio\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim adds that Bryan Ryker found out about this when he stopped in at Allen's Coin Shop. They told him they had it made and handed it out at the fair.

FI-6 (674) 17 – Dr. Harvey Firestone / Optometrist / Logan 2-8000 – West Dearborn, MI\*\* -Jim Lawniczak. Identified on the basis that there is an identified encased from this same merchant that is cataloged in the Michigan catalog as MI-DEA-FI-10.

GA-2 (157) – Garden Villa's Garage / 110 Linden – Houston, TX\*\* - Dan Agler – This is from the 1947 Houston City Directory.

GI-8 (689) 17 – Given Bros / Style Center – El Paso, TX\*\* - Dan Agler. There was a lot of speculation that this was from Arizona. It was found there were stores in both Tucson and Phoenix, but they were branches with headquarters being in El Paso, TX. Dan adds that this was a shoe store, but also at a later date started selling western wear.

GI-7 (688) 17 – Best of Luck / Givens Bros – The above information will also identify this piece.

GO-3 (158) – Bill Goddard Chevrolet – Kansas City, MO\*\* - BP. Listed as Bill Goddard Chevrolet in 1955 D&B.

GO – 1 (8) Golden Hill Post / NO. 8748 / 718 N. Johnson ST. - South Bend, IN\*\* - BP This is from John Palmer of the South Bend Library. I have researched our newspaper clippings files and have discovered the following South Bend Tribune article dated January 5, 1947:

"A new Veterans of Foreign Wars organization, Golden Hill post No. 8748, will be instituted at ceremonies at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon in Cherry hall, Cherry Street and Washington Avenue. The post will be the fourth V. F. W. group in the city. "I don't know exactly when the post moved to 718 N. Johnson street but it was sometime between 1947 and 1949.

GO-6 (495) 13 – Goodman & Barg Auto Parts / Dealers in waste materials – Little Rock, AR\*\* - BP – Listed as Goodman & Barg in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates they had 2 businesses, one for auto parts and one for junk.

GU-3 (694) 17 – Guarantee Auto Supply – Indianapolis, IN\*\* - BP – Guarantee was founded by George Kreitlein on W. Washington St. in 1898. It was a bicycle parts supplier until 1903 when it began selling auto parts. In 1948 there were 20 stores within Indiana. I am forwarding an article on this business to publish in The Casement when space permits.



GU-1 (73) – Sheriff Steve Guthrie / With Compliments – Dallas, TX \*\* - Dan Agler. He served from 1946 to 1948, one term. I found the info in The New Handbook of Texas Online

HE-2 (499) 13 – Hendin's Hollywood Fashion's / 1725 Pennsylvania Ave – Baltimore, MD\*\* - BP – Listed as Hendin's Hollywood Fashions in the 1955 D&B.

JE-3 (435) 12- Eddie E. Jensen/ Painting & Decorating – Duane Fiesel – Los Angeles, CA\*\* I did a bit of work on this. I am convinced that the address is actually Los Angeles, although it is close to being in Culver City. Adding to this conviction is the directory listing I found in the 1953 D&B under Los Angeles for Edward Jensen, builder. There were no Jensen listings for Culver City.

KD-1 (710) 18 – Compliments of K&D Furniture / Farwell Area – Farwell, MI\*\* – Jim Lawniczak. Cataloged as (MI)-FAR-KD-10. Jim adds that there are 8 other Farwell's in the USA he was able to verify that Farwell, MI was founded in 1870. This is also in the 1955 D&B.

KL-1 (267) 8 – Call Klein SA 4041 / Auto tops, seat covers – Baltimore, MD\*\* Charlie Turner. Charlie identified this by using the 1908 postal address guide. I notice there is a Nathan Klein in the 1955 D&B in the auto upholstery and seat cover business.

HA-18 (849) 21 – Kline's Service Station / H.R. Hassinger – Beaver Springs, PA\*\* - Vic Nolan - I have a 1964 Sunbury directory that lists the area of Beaver Springs also. Here's what I found: Kline's service station 658-5143 and Raymond H Hassinger 658-5262.

KO-1 (14) Koppen Theatre / Always the best – Detroit, MI\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim relays that he has enough information to consider this verified to Detroit.

LA-8 (517) 14 – Lawrence Furniture Co / Lawrence – Lawrence, MA\*\* - Gerry Mclellan. The Lawrence Library verified this.

LU – 2 (165) Lucky Boy Bread / Best Buy in your Basket – Galesburg, IL\*\* - BP – Listed as Lucky Boy Bakers Inc. in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates this was a wholesale – retail company,

MI-10 (587) 15. Robert W. Mitchler / State Senator. Illinois\*\*. BP. There is sufficient information on the Internet to establish that Mr. Mitchler was a State senator in Illinois. I found one site that showed him representing the 39<sup>th</sup> Congressional district. Jim Lawniczak adds that Mr. Mitchler is deceased and he has tried to contact his wife whose mailing address was in Oswego, IL, but hasn't heard from her and doesn't really expect to now.

OM-1 (201) 7 – Edward O'Malley Valve Co. / Faucet Repair Sets – Chicago, IL\*\* - Al Zaika – Source is the Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

MI-9 (521) 14 – Miller, “Good Lighting since 1844” – Kansas City, MO\*\* - Al Zaika. Al found Miller Lighting and Fixture Co in the Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

MO- 3 (159) – Molyneux Chevrolet Inc. – Rockwood, TN\*\* - BP – Listed as Molyneux Chevrolet Co. Inc. in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates they had a branch in Harriman, TN.

MO-11 (589) 15 – Mosher Bros / 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary – Northville, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak – The source is the 1939 Farm Directory for Fulton & Montgomery Counties. It shows Mosher Bros. In Northville, “ Celebrating 40 years of service in Northville.” That makes its start up date 1899 and the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary 1949.

NI-1 (381) 11 – Niagara County Cerebral Palsy Clinic – Niagara Falls, NY\*\* – (Niagara County) – Jim Lawniczak - I have spoken with the director of the clinic which is still there today.

NI-2 (524) 14 – Nickey Chevrolet Service- Chicago, IL\*\* – BP – Listed as Nickey Chevrolet Sales Inc. in the 1955 D&B.

OL-1 (155) – Health is Wealth / Old Home / Cottage Cheese – Minneapolis, MN\*\* - BP – Listed as Old Home Creameries Inc. in the 1955 D&B. It indicates they made cottage cheese and also classifies them as a natural cheese company. They also had branches in other cities.

OM-1 (201) 7 – Edward O'Malley Valve Co. / Faucet Repair Sets – Chicago, IL\*\* - Al Zaika – Source is the Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

OS-5 (945) 23 – Bert Osborn / Syracuse Letter Co. – Syracuse, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak – The Syracuse Letter Co. Inc is a NY corp. still active. Today, David Osborn is the CEO, must be a descendant of Bert.

PA-2 (39) – Patricola Jewelers / 518 Elmwood Ave. – Buffalo, NY\*\* – Jim Lawniczak - The source is Buffalo and Erie County historical society their historian found it in the 1953 Buffalo city directory.

RA-1 (201) 7 – Rainbow Shops / Fine Fashion For Smart Women – Jersey City, NJ\*\* – Al Zaika. Source is 1948 D&B.

RE-1 (102) – Regal Clothes / Lucky / 711 7<sup>th</sup> St. – Washington D.C. \*\* - Charlie Turner – Charlie identified this by using the 1908 postal guide. This is also listed as The Regal Clothing Co in the 1955 D&B.

RI – 9 (773) 19 – Riddell Air Freight / Riddell Air Lines – Miami, FL\*\* - BP – This is listed as Riddell Airlines Inc. in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates this was a cargo air carrier and also that they had a branch in NYC.

RO-17 (779) 19 – Jack Roland / Mockingbird Rambler – Dallas, TX\*\* - Terry Cross. I have verified by Dallas phone books and city directories that Mockingbird Rambler was located on Mockingbird Lane in Dallas and had the phone number (214-357-8201) in 1964.

SA-12 (536) 14 – The Salvation Army Women's Emergency Committee –NY, NY\*\* - BP. I found an Internet link to the Salvation Army and emailed them concerning this piece. I was emailed back by Janice O'Dell who is the secretary for the Central Territory Museum of the Salvation Army. Although they tried as hard as possible they could find no information on the Women's Emergency Committee and even speculate that it may be of a foreign origin. She did say that "So far as the address are concerned, we do not know the 1928 address of the "Women's Emergency Committee." The National headquarters of The Salvation Army at that time was 120-130 West Fourteenth Street, New York City. " I think that is enough to identify this.

SH-7 (809) 20 – Sheridan Inn / 1726 Sheridan Road / MAJ 3873 –North Chicago, IL\*\* - BP. The 1946 city directory lists a Sheridan Inn Tavern in North Chicago. The presumed owner was John Miller and Helen Pinpich. The 1945 telephone directory gave a number as Majestic-5873. Peter Sprenkle - Waukegan Public Library. (NOTE) The phone # is off by one digit and I wonder if this could be a typo?

SH-4 (807) 20 and also SH-8 (810) 20 – Harold L. Shyer / Your Jeweler – Nashville, TN\*\* - BP – This is listed as Harold L. Shyer Jeweler Inc. in the 1955 D&B.

SK -1 (209) – Sky rider Shoes for Boys – Nashville, TN\*\* - Al Zaika. Al ads that these were made by Genesco Inc. in Nashville and thinks he identified it before. Reference is Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

SM-4 (811) 20 – Smith Furnishing Co / Clarksburg – Clarksburg, WV\*\* - BP – This is listed as Smith Furnishing Co in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates this was a furniture business.

SM-3 (448) 12 –Jack Smith's Restaurant / 309-311 Monroe ST – Toledo, Ohio\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim states that there is an encased in the Ohio listings with the same wording, but also include the word Toledo on it.

SN-2 (449) 12 – Snow White Palace / Drive - In / Lincoln & Crawford – Chicago, IL\*\* - Charlie Turner – Charlie also identified this by using the 1908 postal guide. It is listed as Snow White Grill Inc. in the 1955 D&B.

SO-8 (813) 20 – Carl Soda / Texaco / 3357 E. Tremont – Bronx, NY\*\* - BP. Listed as Carl Soda in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates he had a service station and used car business

ST-7 (261) 8- Stag Cafe / 7<sup>th</sup> & Roberts – Newport, KY\*\* - Charlie Turner. Charlie identified this with no supporting information. I notice lot 62 in the NATCA 2001 Auction is an identified token from this same business at the same address. I assume Charlie knew there was a known token.

ST-28 (868) 21 – Rush Stallings / Studebaker / Sales & Service – Montgomery, AL\*\* - BP – Listed as Rush Stallings Inc in 1955 D&B. It also indicates they sold new and used autos.

PL-1 (766) 19 – Plywood, Lumber & Millwork / Stone Lumber Co – Bristol, CN\*\* - Al Zaika. Source is Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

SE-11 (900) 22 – Meet Me / Sennings. Louisville, KY\* –Turner/Perdue. I found there was a former park/zoo named Sennings from Louisville and asked Charlie Turner, an exnumia dealer from Louisville what he thought about it being from there and he thought it was very likely. He also said he had seen tokens from Sennings. There isn't enough information on this encased to make it positive, but here is some information from an article written by Linda Lyly of the Louisville Journal-Courier. "Sennings Park was built in the late 1800s by Fred Senning, who came to Louisville from Germany in 1868. After opening a restaurant, hotel and the city's first commercial bowling alley, Senning and his wife, Minnie, decided to try their luck in the community growing around Iroquois Park. Although their establishment was called a park, it featured dining and dancing under gaslights. In the 1920s, they added a miniature zoo – considered another first in the city. The facility, between Iroquois Park and Kenwood Hill, closed after Senning's death in 1939. Minnie Senning sold the property for \$10,000 to B. A. Watson the following year. He converted it into the now-defunct Colonial Gardens."

SU-4 (871) 21-Sullivan in 68 for President, VFW Auxiliary 114, 1968D – Evansville, IN\*\* - BP

SY-2 (822) 20 - All The Way With Sylvia in 68 for Dept. President, V.F.W. 1114, 1968D – Evansville, IN\*\* - BP

If you combine the information on both pcs you could surmise that Sylvia Sullivan ran for president of the VFW 1114 Auxiliary in 1968. VFW post 1114 is located at 110 N. Wabash in Evansville, IN. I contacted Marilyn Wilkerson of the Evansville Vanderburgh Public Library. She did verify the existence of the VFW at that address in 1968 and had this to say on Sylvia Sullivan. There was a Sylvia Sullivan (listed under her husband, Milford Sullivan) in the 1970 city directory. She had also added that this information wasn't in the 1968 city directory. It is possible that Sylvia wasn't living within the city limits, but somewhere within the county and didn't appear in the earlier directories. There are no later listings or obituaries within the county for Sylvia either. Would the owner of these 2 pcs please contact me? I'd like to get complete information on them.

PL-1 (766) 19 – Plywood, Lumber & Millwork / Stone Lumber Co – Bristol, CN\*\* - Al Zaika. Source is Thomas Register of American Manufacturers.

TE-2 (213) 7 – Tek-Ni-Kal Credit Union – Warren, MI\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim adds that he has seen numerous references to this being in Michigan. He checked on it and found it's still in existence in Warren, MI.

TI-2 (903) 22 – Tiedman's Ice Cream / 191-09 Jamaica Ave. – Queens, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak – Jim reports that this is a typo and should be Tiedemann's Ice Cream. He also adds this kind of hyphenated address is common in Queens and it just means 19109 Jamaica Ave. The hyphen just makes it clear how to divide the address. The 191 means that the address is just east of 191<sup>st</sup> Street. Jamaica Ave. is a main east and west street through Queens.

TR-4 (878) 21 – Tresca the Florist / Flowers for all occasions – Jacksonville, FL\*\* - BP. This is a little play on word. Tresca the florist is actually listed as Florist Tresca in the 1955 D&B. It also indicates Mr. (?) Tresca was the owner of a sawmill and also a florist.

TR-1 (24) – Triangle Realty / Lofts – Factories – New York, New York\*\* - Jim Lawniczak. Jim states there is also an identified encased from this merchant at the same address, but also has NYC as part of the address.

TW-1 (301) 9 – Twon Drive In / Telegraph Rd at Chicago Blvd – Redford, MI\*\* Jim Lawniczak. Jim adds that this is a typo and should be Town Drive In. No question it is from here as the address matches and Jim has personal information from people who have attended the drive in.

UN-1 (110) – United Woolen Mills Co / 105 Grand Ave – Milwaukee, WI\*\* - Tom Casper. The United Woolen Mills piece is listed in the 1909 Milwaukee, WI City Directory at 105 Grand Ave.

WS-1 (305) 9 - WSIX AM&FM Legion Post #51 / 11<sup>th</sup> Annual - Nashville, Tennessee\*\* - Tom Casper. I called Ready Reference section of the Milwaukee library and got the name of the book they use. It is "The Gale Directory of Publications and Broadcast Media" This information is taken from that book.

WI-4 (408) 11 –Wilson's Leading Jewelry / Bring an honest face – Syracuse, NY\*\* - Jim Lawniczak -. The Wilson's piece is particularly interesting as they used the slogan "Leading Jewelers" right in the corporate name! I just went to the NY SOS web page and searched for Wilson's Leading and it was a NY corporation (now inactive) that started in 1930. The last address for the corporation was in Fayetteville NY, which is a eastern suburb of Syracuse. My guess is that the jewelry store moved out to Fayetteville sometime between 1955 when it was listed in Syracuse in your D & B and when the business closed down. (This is listed as Wilson's Leading Jewelry Inc. in the 1955 D&B.)

## Askin's Clothing

Askin's Clothing is not an unidentified ACE maverick; in fact it is probably the most identified encased in the entire hobby. I've always had a curiosity about this encased because it was one of the few that Lloyd Wagaman chose to include in the trade tokens of Indiana book. Lloyd has it listed as;

I-1250 - Askin's / Family / Clothes / Easy / Credit / This Coin Is Worth / \$2.00  
Credit / On \$20.00 Purchase // kmangb, 1948D, (151 Illinois St)

I contacted the Indianapolis library some time back and asked them for information on Askin's. I was given little more than the address verification. I had almost given up hope of ever being able to gain conclusive information of this encased until very recently I came up with an R. G. Dunn reference book dated 1922 and covering the State of Indiana. In it I found listed in Indianapolis "Askin & Marine Co. / Clothing & Caps / Branch of New York City - Manhattan"

At last it appeared some progress was being made on an identity for this. This was further confirmed when I bought a National Dun & Bradstreet directory for the year 1955. There is no listing in this book for Askin's in Indianapolis or any other of the several cities that ACE members have identified it to that I can find. It is possible that by 1955 all of the Askin's stores had closed, as the encased was dated in the late 1940's. There are however listings for Askin Stores Inc at 461 Eighth Ave. and Askin's Retail Stores Inc. at 860 Broadway. These are in the NYC - Bronx/Manhattan section of the book. As Jim Lawniczak is in the process of cataloging the State of New York I emailed all of the information I had to him. Jim is able to access an Internet search service through his office. He wrote back with the following information:

Well maybe I've mailed down the Askin's. I went into Lexis and looked under their all news database and their legal case database. On all news, I found two obituaries from the N.Y. Times, one from 1982 and the other from 1988, which told me that Seymour R. Askin was the former president of Askin Stores, Inc., a 65 unit chain of clothing stores, mostly located in the South and Southwest. He was from NYC. The other was the obit of Arnold S. Askin, Seymour's brother, who was the former owner of Askin Stores, a company founded by their father. The business was sold by the Askin's in 1960. He was also from NYC. Then, on the legal side, Askin Stores Inc. has been a party to 4 reported legal cases, one from 1938 in Florida, another from 1947 in Georgia, a third from 1940 in Ohio and a fourth from 1957 in Texas. This is consistent with the reports on this NY company that most of its operations were in the South and Southwest!

Anyway, in light of the fact that the dates match, the type of business matches, your information on the location of corporate offices in NYC and the founding of the company in NYC and its owners being from NYC, I am willing to put this into the NY catalog as a NYC piece.

It looks as if at last we have a true home for the Askin's Clothing encased. It also appears likely that Wagaman and others have taken information from city directories that don't in most cases list stores as being a branch. The question now is as one of the Askin brothers was named Seymour is there any connection to the Seymour clothing encased, which has also been widely identified? It looks like another snowy afternoon will have to be spent on looking for information on this. If you would have any please send it in.

# INTRODUCTION

This is an attempt to catalog all of the mavericks that have been identified by ACE. I have gone through all of the back issues and taken information from many sources and combined them in one place. I have also attempted to contact all of the state catalogers and sought the mavericks they have identified to their various states. It is known that this is an incomplete work. Many state catalogs are incomplete and the authors are still in the process of gathering information. The final version of this index isn't needed until 2004, when the last of the ACE books of the state's encased listings is to be published. It is hoped that we can continue to add information up until that point. I have had many requests for this information and wanted to make the information I currently have available to the membership. The purpose in releasing this information now is to allow a period for correction and also addition of the content.

## HOW TO USE THE INDEX

The index has a very simple and concise format. There were many experimental attempts with different formats. At one-point dates, catalog numbers, shape, and varieties were all considered for listings. This format was decided upon mainly due to the inadequate computer skills of yours truly. The other formats tried resulted in a page too wide to print or other unacceptable results. As an index the purpose is to provide a reference where the user may attain complete information. There may be several varieties of an individual encased, but only the main subject is listed within. The user should be able to turn to the reference for complete information. This information may be unavailable until all of the state catalogs are complete. It is intended that if the user is looking up an encased for Joe's Bar that information could be found under the letter J and the Joe's should be in bold print. If one were seeking information on Joe Brown's Bar that information could be found under the letter B and the Brown's should be in bold print. The listing should be under the last name of the business, where that information is included on the encased. I am aware that not all of the listings comply with this guideline. There are cases where I'm unsure if the business is a first and last name or a partnership. I hope we can work together to correct these situations. If you are a state cataloger please take the time to go over the information for your state (s). If you feel listings are in error please contact me. It will do little good to have an index that the user is unable to use. Where the information in the reference column is a two-letter abbreviation of a state, one would need to look in that state's listings for additional information. If it is a number then one would look in that issue of THE CASEMENT for additional information. If the reference is Fankhauser then one would need to look in Bryan Ryker's book for complete information. As I was preparing this for printing I decided to add a number of listings that have not been verified as being correct. You will find unverified in the reference column for these. It is hoped that the membership will help to make these positive. If not they will be removed before the final version of this index is completed.

## COMPANION PUBLICATION

This index was intended to be used with the ACE publication **THE CASEMENT**. The user will have to refer to it to verify the information included. It will be impossible to establish the validity of any identification without a cross-reference.

## WE ARE ALL VOLUNTEERS!

In working on this index I have been made keenly aware of the time and effort required by state catalogers to complete their work. I don't think any have made enough money from their efforts to retire to a tropical island or are in line to win a Pulitzer Prize for literature. We all do this for one reason, we like the hobby. Kudos are in order for those who have contributed. We are all human and all make errors. It is indigenous to the species. If you are looking this index over before you fault the work of others, it might be better to ask what was your contribution to the finished product?

## PROBLEMS, PROBLEMS, PROBLEMS

As I am preparing this for printing I am aware of several problems within. Most notably are;

**DUPLICATION OF IDENTIFICATION** — It is inconceivable to me that an encased with the same date and address could appear as being from both Montana and Vermont on this index. There are many reasons for this, but I hope all can be corrected in time for the finished product. I have no desire to become the "maverick policeman" and say who is right or wrong. It is hoped that state catalogers can compare information and resolve disputed identifications between each other. The benefit of the finished product will depend upon that effort.

**SPELLING** — I have tried to be as careful as possible in copying information. In some cases the information may have been sent to me in error. In others the mistake is mine. In any event the state cataloger will have to determine if the listing is correct. I do not have the original information for listings to review.

**WRONG IDENTITIES** — Even if you use the most authoritative source available for identification there may still be errors. If you go back through the back issues of **THE CASEMENT** you can see that there were many sources used for identification. In some cases this was simply personal knowledge. In other cases original identifications have been changed. Any work of this type is a constant work in progress. Information should constantly be updated to reflect changes. It is also felt that a certainty of attribution

quotient should be assigned to each newly identified maverick. The current ACE method is to assign one (\*) to a probable identification and two (\*\*) to a certain identification. This method works well, but a broader scale would be more beneficial to the user. Duane Feisel has proposed a 1-4 scale. With (1) being a guess, (2) being based on some information, (3) being based on substantial information, and (4) being proof positive. A scale of this type would benefit the user tremendously. It would indicate whether additional research was needed or if the information was conclusive. This would also allow for the state catalogers to include those problematic type encased that can't, despite tedious efforts be made positive. It is hoped that ACE will adopt this or a similar system.

**I DON'T AGREE** — There are cases where encased have been identified in the ACE maverick section that the state cataloger simply doesn't agree with. The state catalog should be the ultimate authority for a listing. Where there is disagreement the user will still find a reference to the encased on the index, but will be unable to find additional information in that state's listings.

**SUGGESTIONS?** — This is only a first draft. If you are having problems using the index please let me know what your problems are. I hope to have a much better finished product available by 2004.

## The Michael Kolman Encased Coin Collection

Here is the start of the Kurt R. Krueger Auction #124 which closed Aug. 27, 1992 which showcased the Kolman Encased Coin Collection. Several ACE members requested that ACE make a copy of this sale to show what a great collection the late Michael Kolman had built through his collecting years. There were 822 lots offered featuring encased coins from the U.S., Canada, Denmark, Germany, Great Britain, Israel, Italy, Mexico, South Africa, Spain and Switzerland. Most denominations and shapes were represented in the Kolman collection.

Issue 25 will show the first six pages of the Krueger sale. (lots 1-274) In Issue 26 and subsequent issues (depending on space) the remaining twelve pages of the lots will be featured, along with the prices realized and some of the 38 pages of pictures. This of course will depend on whether any will copy.

As an introduction to the sale Krueger wrote about the evolution of encased cents. He writes, "While preparing the Michael Kolman collection of encased coins for presentation in this auction catalog we recalled an article in the June 1988 issue of TAMS, written by Mr. Kolman, which detailed the possible beginning of the encased coin, and related its inception to the encased postage stamps used during the Civil War--when stamps were used as change in an attempt to ease the shortage of coins due to the hoarding which went on at the time. The encased stamp was the brain child of John Gault, who tried to promote its use by the government. Failing that, he tried to interest merchants in using the back of the frame for advertising. The idea never took hold as Gault hoped it would, hence the scarcity of encased postage stamps today.

The use of tokens which resembled cents but also had the advantage of being an advertising medium, became popular during the Civil War--as witness the variety of these tokens available to the collector today. Perhaps both of these things--encased postage stamps and Civil War merchant trade tokens--were part of the evolution of encased cents."

Krueger also wrote this about scarcity in his introduction: "The scarcity of many of the older dates is due to the buying power of the cent in earlier years. When eggs sold for 13 cents a dozen, and bread for 5 cents a loaf(day old for 3 cents)--the temptation to take the cents from the holders was probably overwhelming."
